April Voters Meeting Minutes

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Pastor Bagnall.

Kian Hoppe was welcomed as a new voting member.

The minutes from the January meeting were read. Bruce Hecht made a motion to accept the minutes as read. It was seconded by Ken Martin and the motion passed.

The treasurer's report was given by Roger Gnagey. Susan Hoppe made a motion to accept the report. Ken Martin seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Communications: None

BOARD REPORTS:

Elders- Paul Kruse sought the voters' approval for the transfer in of Judy Boldt from Our Savior, Bad Axe. Sharon Rockwell made a motion to accept the transfer. Diane Lowe seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Trustees- Pete Martin reported that the floors had been buffed and the trustees received a quote of \$31,000 for solar panels on the educational wing. They are working on how long it would take to recoup the cost. The trustees asked for voter approval to remove the sink in the nursery and replace the carpeting on the south side of the educational wing. Susan Hoppe made the motion to approve the trustee request. It was seconded by Ron Guinther and the motion passed.

Board of Education- Anna Irwin reported that the Sunday school teachers would like to be able to attend Voters' meetings and request that the meeting time be moved if possible. After much discussion Susan Hoppe made a motion to table the vote until the July meeting. The motion was seconded and the motion passed.

Board of Evangelism- Judy Hahn made a motion to approve of Cindy Clements and Joann Guinther as new board members. It was seconded by Jackie Guinther and the motion passed. The board is looking into participating in the Fourth of July parade and may sponsor a movie at the theater.

Long Range Planning- Susan Hoppe made the motion to set the 2024 Long Range Planning division as such: 55% of the fund to the roof fund, 35% to the parking lot and 10% for parsonage repairs. It was seconded by Connie McNaughton and the motion passed. Susan Hoppe made a motion to move forward on the next project from Long Range Planning which would be the enclosure of the East and South doors. Connie McNaughton seconded the motion and the motion passed.

BUSINESS:

- Amy Talaski made a motion to set Pastor's 2024 Housing Allowance at \$6,000. The motion was seconded by Bruce Hecht and the motion carried.
- Sue Pawloski made a motion to split the Fortress distribution (\$6,826.64) evenly between Lutheran Heritage, PABLO, The Garuna Foundation and Ghana Harvest. The motion was seconded by Diane Lowe and the motion passed.
- Council proposed a change to the church by-laws to exempt Sunday school teachers and those who count money from having to sign in to keep their voters status. This will be discussed along with the Voters' meeting time change at the July meeting.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported that Confirmation has been changed to May 12th. He requested that when we get the handheld mic that it would be used by those speaking during voters' meeting .

A motion was made by Ken Martin to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded Pam Gnagey and passed.

Four stained glass windows were placed into the front window of the church when it was built in 1967.

The Incarnation: God Becomes man! The star, manger, and shepherd's staff in the shape of a cross serve to illustrate the means God employed to express His love for a world which had become most unlovable. Because God in Christ has taken on the human frame, He shares our burdens and we share in His goodness. "We love Him because He first loved us."

The Body of Believers which we call the Church are a creation of God. He has brought them into the unsinkable ship which rides the seas of life. The masthead of the ship is the cross. "I believe in the one, holy, Apostolic, Christian Church; the Communion of Saints." The Holy Spirit: The Presence and Power of God at Work! The dove, symbol of the Spirit of God, as well as the flames surrounding it serve to express the ongoing, dynamic and yet peaceful nature of God who guides and directs the Christian Church. "The God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope through the power of the Holy Spirit."

Thank you


Thanks to all that helped and/or contributed to the turkey dinner. It was a very busy Friday, Saturday and Sunday including hauling food, cooking turkeys,

We serve as caretakers of our congregation by supporting and helping Pastor and church council care for the members of our church. I often think of our role as that of Mom, we do everything we can to make sure things go smoothly and that all feel cared for.

Our responsibilities include:

- Providing food for suppers, funeral dinners, Sunday school snacks, coffee hour, bake sales, etc.
- Knitting shawls for the sick.
- Sending cards or visiting shut-ins.
- Organizing potlucks/dinners for special occasions such as Mission Sundays, meetings, celebrations.

- Care and cleaning of the kitchen.
- Providing money or supplies needed for organizations in our community.
- Organizing special social activities such as Greenhouse Hop, Loon games, game nights, Spirit games, etc.
