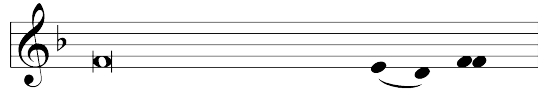

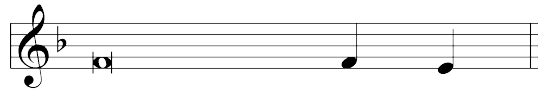

Procession enters through Narthex and stops at rear door of nave.

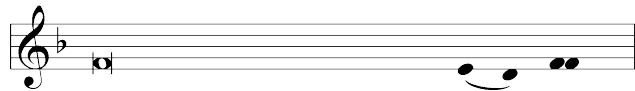

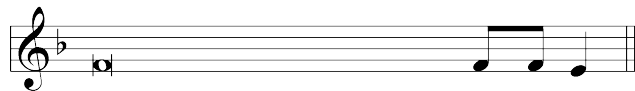

Procession moves to the center of the nave

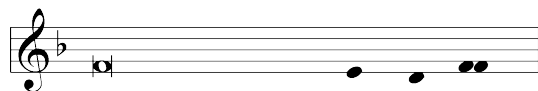

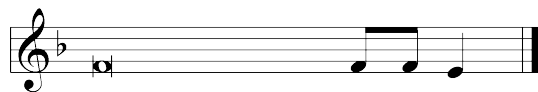
